Just a reminder that we are a scent free school. This would include items such as perfumes, hair gels and hand sanitizers.



Reporting Illnesses

Please phone the school at 902-896-5511 whenever your child is absent due to illness. Safe arrival can be time consuming when several calls need to be made to confirm that a child is excused for the day. Parents are asked to inform the school if the illness is either viral (vomiting, diarrhea) or respiratory (cold, cough, etc). We would also like to be informed of any student illness such as Impetigo, Foot and Mouth, and Fifth's to mention a few in order to prevent its spread. Also, parents should inform the school of head lice so we can provide information to our school community in order to prevent it from spreading to others.

Attendance & Late Arrivals

Student attendance and late arrivals continues to be an area of concern. Please remember that school begins at 8:40 am and supervision is provided from 8:20 am onwards. If students are late they need to report to the office for a late slip, so we are aware that they have arrived and that the office does not call home when your child is at school. We realize that there are occasions when students may have to arrive late for various reasons; however, when students arrive late it does interrupt instruction that has already begun. It is important to have your child/children to school on time. Also, if your child is going to be absent—remember to communicate this to the school so that we can report their absence as excused. Thank you for your attention to this matter.
